### **SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

#### **1 RULES**

- 1.1 The race will be governed by the *rules* as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.

#### **2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS**

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located at National Sailing Centre.

#### **3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY**

- 3.1 The regatta is open to the following NSC squads:
  - Optimist Advanced (A, B & C)
  - Byte Sailing Squad, Intermediate & Advanced
  - 420
  - Schools training with SingaporeSailing under package A
  - NOSS Racing Squad
- 3.2 A maximum of 5 entries per school is allowed under the school category.
- 3.3 Competitors must have at least SOF Opti-Racer certification, SingaporeSailing Level 1 Proficiency certificate or its equivalent.

#### **4 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 1230hrs on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 1800hrs on the day before it will take effect.

#### **5 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE**

5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the flag staff located at the boat park.

5.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes' in race signal AP.

**5.3 A boat shall not launch until Flag D is displayed.**

Flag D means: 'The warning signal will be made not less than 30 minutes after flag D is displayed or not before the scheduled time, whichever is later. Boats shall not launch until this signal is made'.

**6 SCHEDULE OF RACES**

6.1 Dates of racing:

20 February 2010	Racing	1 <sup>st</sup> warning signal at 1430 hrs
21 February 2010	Racing	1 <sup>st</sup> warning signal at 1300 hrs

6.2 There will be no limit to the number of races per day.

6.2 On the last day of the race no warning signal will be made after **1600hrs**.

**7 CLASS FLAGS**

The class flags will be:

<i>Class</i>	<i>Flag</i>
Optimist	Black letter 'OPT' on yellow backing
Byte	Black letter 'BYTE' on dark purple backing
420	White '420' on dark Brown backing

**8 RACING AREAS**

Racing area will be on the waters in the vicinity of the National Sailing Centre.

**9 THE COURSES**

The diagrams in Attachment 1 show the courses, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.

**10 MARKS**

10.1 Marks 1, 2, 3 & 4 will be pink spherical marks.

10.2 The starting mark will be a yellow spherical buoy.

10.3 The finishing mark will be a blue spherical buoy.

**11 THE START**

11.1 Races will be started using rule 26, with the warning signal given 5 minutes before the starting signal.

11.2 The starting line will be between the race committee signal boat and the starting mark.

11.3 A boat starting later than 4 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start. This changes rule A4.

## **12 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE**

12.1 To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will either move the original mark to a new position or lay a new mark and remove the original mark as soon as practicable. When in a subsequent change a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by an original mark.

## **13 THE FINISH**

The finishing line will be the race committee signal boat displaying a **blue flag** and the finishing mark

## **14 TIME LIMITS**

14.1 Time Limits are as follows:

<b>Class</b>	<b>Time Limit</b>
Optimist/Byte/420/Pacer	70 minutes

14.2 Boats failing to finish within 20 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes or within the time limit, whichever is the later, will be scored Did Not Finish. This changes rules 35 and A4.1.

## **15 SCORING**

15.1 A maximum of 7 races are scheduled.

(a) When 7 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

(b) There is no maximum number of races per day.

## **16 SAFETY REGULATIONS**

16.1 **Buoyancy:** All competitors shall wear personal flotation devices at all times whilst afloat.

16.2 **Check-out and check-in:** Each boat shall personally sign-on on the forms provided at the Race Office prior to launching for the first race of the day. After arriving on shore, each boat shall personally sign-off on the forms provided within the protest time limit.

16.3 A boat failing to comply with instruction 16.2 may be protested by the race committee. The penalty is a DSQ in the first race of the day.

## **17 REPLACEMENT OF CREW OR EQUIPMENT**

17.1 Substitution of damaged or lost equipment will not be allowed unless authorised by the race committee. Requests for substitution shall be made to the committee at the first reasonable opportunity.

## 18 EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the class rules and sailing instructions. On the water, a boat can be instructed by a race committee measurer to proceed immediately to a designated area for inspection.

## 19 PENALTY SYSTEM

Appendix P will apply. Coaches and Race officials will act as “jury on water” by making a sound signal to attract the sailor’s attention to do penalty.

## 20 FOUL LANGUAGE

Foul language is prohibited during this regatta. Any competitor emitting foul language loud enough to be heard by another person, regardless at whom the foul language was directed, shall be subjected to a hearing under RRS 69. Any boat may file a report against another boat from which it heard foul language. On the first offence, the penalty is a DSQ when the incident is deemed to be in breach of good sportsmanship. Upon a second offence, the penalty is a DNE. Upon the third offence, the penalty is a disqualification from the regatta.

## 21 COACHES BOAT

As this is a training Regatta for the sailors, only coach boats are allowed to enter the race area to guide the beginner racer whom are having difficulties in racing or handling of their boat.

## 22 TRASH DISPOSAL

Boats shall not put trash in the water. Trash may be placed aboard support and race committee boats.

## 23 RADIO COMMUNICATION

A boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

## 24 PRIZES

Prizes will be given as follows:

Advance ‘B’	1 <sup>st</sup> – 3 <sup>rd</sup> (min of 7 boats racing)
Advance ‘C’	1 <sup>st</sup> – 3 <sup>rd</sup> (min of 7 boats racing)

24.2 NOSS Opti Racing Squad 1<sup>st</sup> – 3<sup>rd</sup> (min of 7 boats racing)

24.3 School Optimist Open 1<sup>st</sup> – 5<sup>th</sup> (min of 10 boats racing for school category)

**26 INSURANCE**

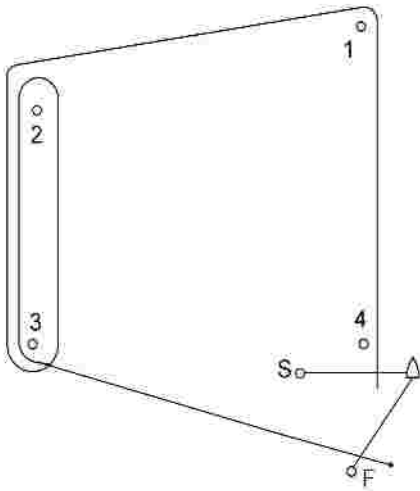
All competitors are required to have appropriate insurance coverage

**Course Flag "I2" (Inner Loop – 2 laps)**

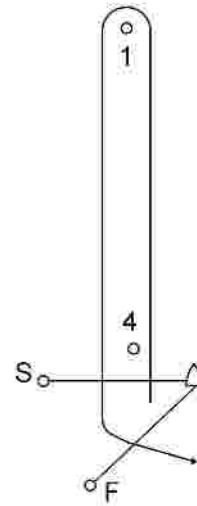
S- 1 - 4 - 1 - 4 - 1 - 2 - 3 - F
